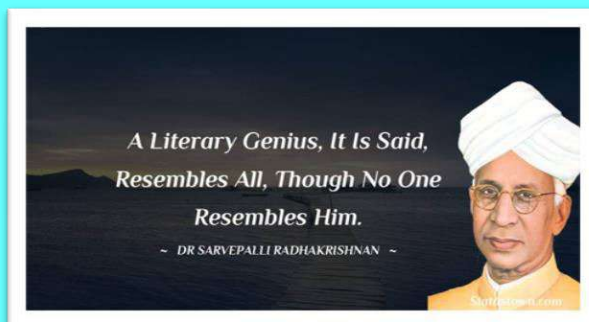




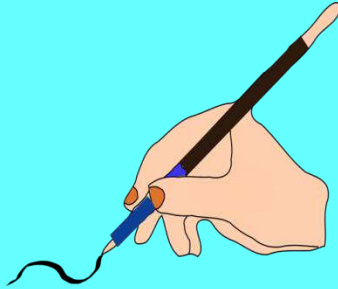

Malaria awareness (World malaria day)

The Gyan Vigyan Club organised a special awareness talk during the morning assembly on the occasion of World Malaria Day. The objective was to educate students about the causes, symptoms, and preventive measures of malaria. Ekta Rani Ma'am, PGT Physics, addressed the students and explained that malaria is caused by the Plasmodium parasite, which spreads through the bite of an infected female Anopheles mosquito. She discussed common symptoms such as high fever, chills, headache, and body pain, emphasizing the need for early diagnosis and timely treatment.



Menstrual Hygiene

A special session on Menstrual Hygiene was conducted on 10th April 2026 for girls of Classes VI to XII, in compliance with CBSE guidelines and under the Adolescence Education Programme. The objective was to provide scientific information, dispel taboos, and promote safe, dignified menstrual practices. Students were psycho guided about the biological process of menstruation, variation in cycle length, and management of common concerns like cramps, irregular periods, etc. Key emphasis was placed on hygiene practices including regular changing of sanitary pads every 4-6 hours, proper washing and drying of reusable cloth, safe disposal of sanitary waste using the incinerator installed in girls' washrooms, and hand hygiene. Students participated actively in the Q&A round, shared concerns and cleared their doubts.





Myths and facts of adolescence

An interactive session under the Adolescence Education Programme was conducted during school assembly on 21st April 2026 for students to address common myths and facts related to adolescence. The resource team explained that adolescence involves physical, emotional, cognitive, and social changes, and mood swings due to hormonal shifts are natural for both boys and girls. Various key myths such as “puberty is only physical,” “adolescence prefer virtual interaction,” “adolescence are aggressive and lazy” and alike were dispelled with scientific facts, emphasizing the age-appropriate information to guide them well and to build their confidence.

2. Resource Persons

The session was conducted by:

2. Dr. Gauri Mishra - Focused on "Teacher's Role in Building Emotional Resilience" and handling classroom behaviour

3. Key Highlights of the Workshop

- Understanding SEL: Definition, 5 core competencies, and importance in NEP 2020
- Dr. Divya Verma's Session:
 - How to create an emotionally safe classroom

- Dr. Gauri Mishra's Session:

- Identifying signs of stress, anxiety in students
- Techniques for self-regulation: deep breathing, pause-and-reflect
- Building positive teacher-student relationships and conflict resolution
- Role of teachers in modelling empathy and responsible decision-making
- Group Activity: Teachers designed 1 SEL activity for their own grade.

4. Teacher Participation

Teachers participated actively in discussions, role-plays, and activity planning. Case studies and real classroom situations were discussed. Teachers shared challenges and got solutions from both resource persons.

5. Outcome

By the end of the workshop, teachers were able to:

1. Understand and apply the 5 SEL competencies in class
2. Use daily 5-minute SEL practices like check-ins and mind ful moments
3. Support students' emotional well-being and manage classroom behaviour positively
4. Integrate SEL with curriculum and textbook lessons

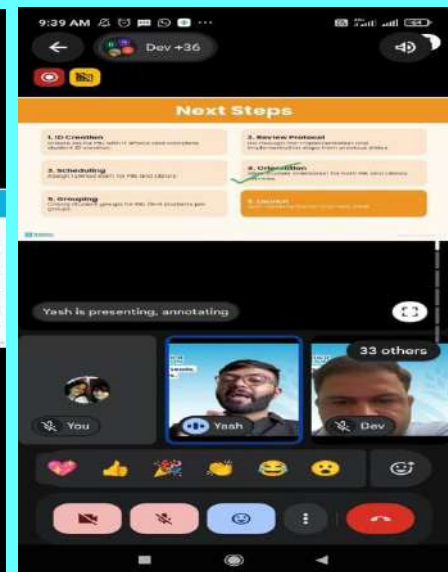
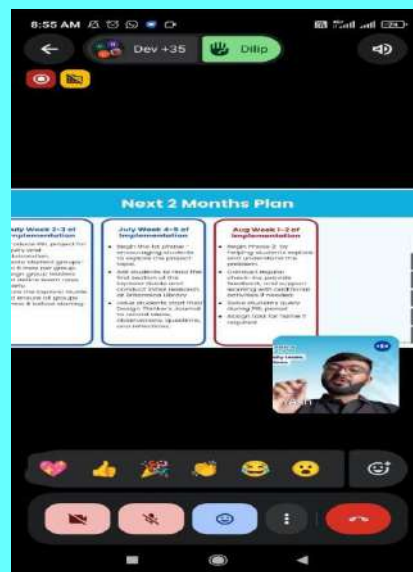
Proud moment

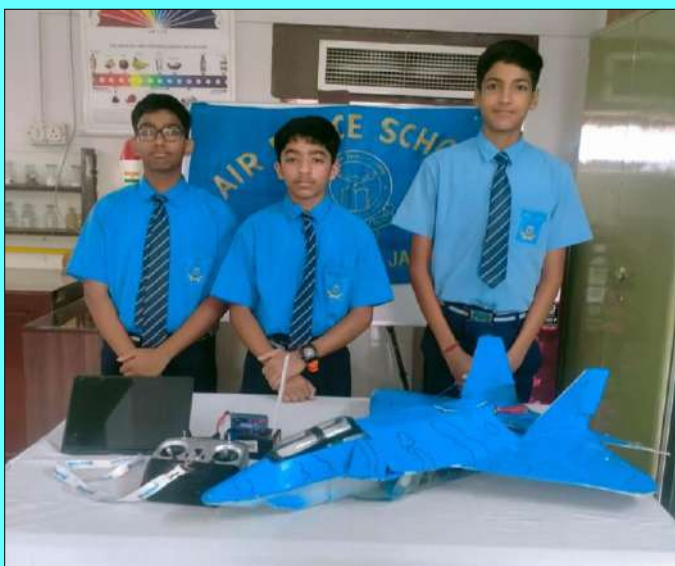

This project presents a Radio-Controlled (RC) Fighter Jet Model designed to demonstrate the principles of aerodynamics, flight control, and aircraft engineering. The model is constructed using lightweight foam material and equipped with an RC control system, allowing it to be operated remotely. Through this project, students gain practical knowledge of lift, thrust, drag, and stability, which are essential concepts in aviation. The fighter jet design is inspired by modern military aircraft and incorporates aerodynamic features that improve flight performance. The project encourages innovation, teamwork, problem-solving, and hands-on learning in STEM. It also helps students understand the role of aircraft technology in national defense and civil aviation. By building and testing the model, students develop technical skills and creativity while exploring real-world applications of physics and engineering.

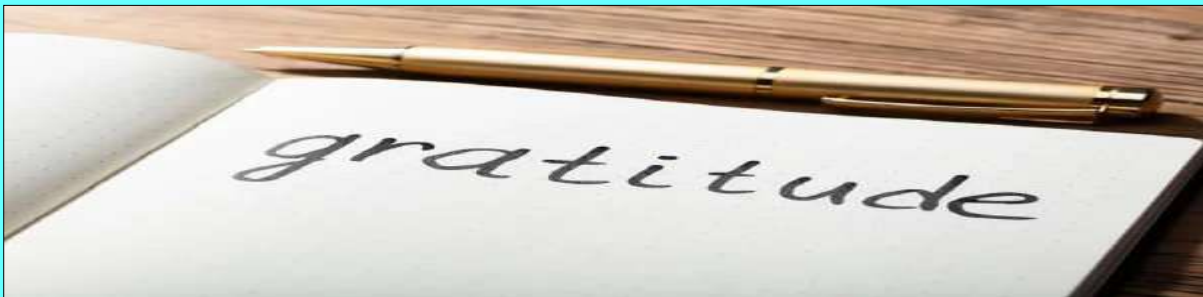
Jal pakhwada pledge
